

Mission: Identify risks and explore needs for SOGI youth in our community with a focus on collaboration, education, outreach, and support

## 2016 Survey Summary Report

SOGI YAC is a collaborative of local leaders and advocates who want to use their cross-system influence to build a safer, more affirming community for youth in Saginaw County. The Council was formed in 2015 when Saginaw MAX, having committed to providing outreach and support to LGBTQ+ youth with emotional and behavioral challenges, convened a group to identify community needs. After the initial task was completed, the collected individuals determined that they had a united and much-needed purpose and have expanded their vision and membership. Members include representatives from mental health, schools, college/universities, the faith community, juvenile justice, child welfare, health care, LGBTQ+ advocacy and support groups, youth and families.

The Great Lakes Bay Pride Festival provided an excellent opportunity to collect data from local youth. With input from all members of SOGI YAC, both a youth and caregiver survey was developed. Questions asked about safety concerns, counselor preferences, and resource needs. Approximately 1,250 people of all ages attended the event. Individuals completing the survey received a rainbow lei for their participation.

Although the survey resulted in some of the only local data on LGBTQ+ youth needs, interpretations should be made with caution. The sample size is small and may not be representative. Experiences of youth who are comfortable enough to attend a Pride Festival may be different than others. Additionally, the festival was held in neighboring Bay County, so not all responses reflect the opinions of Saginaw County residents.

This report describes the results from the youth and caregiver surveys. For simplicity, "LGBTQ+" is used to describe the diverse array of terms youth and caregivers used to describe their sexual orientation and gender identity. Youth and caregivers of youth who identify as LGBTQ+ are compared with those who do not. Ns reflect the number of respondents to an individual guestion, and were used to calculate percentages throughout the report.

#### **Key Study Questions:**

- 1. How safe and supported to LGBTQ+ youth feel in their community? Do feelings differ at home, in school, or in their neighborhood? Are perceptions different for non-LGBTQ+ youth?
- 2. In what situations have caregivers advocated for their youth?
- 3. What characteristics do youth and caregivers look for in a counselor?
- 4. What resources or programs are youth and caregivers interested in?

- 198 Youth Surveys
  - 156 LGBTQ+ youth
- **56** Caregiver Surveys
  - 28 Caregivers of LGBTQ+ youth





## What sex were you assigned at birth, on your original birth certificate? (n=198)












# Among LGBTQ+ Youth <u>NOT</u> "living a fully out life" (n=88):


If you are an LGBTQ+ person, check how safe you feel in each area:


If you are an LGBTQ+ person, check how supported you feel in each area:









#### Which best describes you?





If yes, caregivers provided ages and perceived sexual/gender identity for up to 3 children/youth.







## Which best represents how you think of yourself? (Check all that apply.)





## How do you describe your race and/or ethnicity? (Check all that apply).




## **CAREGIVER: RISK PERCEPTIONS**

Check all you feel to be a great risk for LGBTQ+ youth in your community





To ensure that the youth that you care for is treated with respect and fairness, have you been directly involved with other adults on their behalf? Please indicate for each of the following environments.


